How to form Workgroups

1. Prepare: please think about community related ideas/topics/software you would like to be solved/improved by working together this weekend
2. Ideas: we will collect them in the beginning
3. Participate: participants can add themselves to ideas/topics where they think they can contribute and help to push the topic
4. Choose: we will choose the most interesting ones where we can form good groups
5. Lead: groups will elect a "speaker/group leader" who will be responsible to keep the group on track
6. Work: there will be ca. 2-3 parallel groups each day (i.e. working on different topics on Sat and Sun is possible)
7. Lunch: Pizza service
8. Results: the speakers should at the end of each day provide and present 2-3 sentences about what has been achieved so that we can tell the public about the progress
